

LEAD-IN ACTIVITY SUGGESTIONS	
1. Ask a volunteer to come to the front of the room and sit in a chair. Provide a stuffed animal or object for them to hold.	
2. Ask classmates to tell you who the person is, what the place is (where they are), and to name the object they are holding.	
<ol> <li>Provide the definition of a noun (a noun names a person, place, or thing). Students repeat the definition.</li> <li>Choose a new volunteer and repeat the demonstration as many times as needed.</li> <li>Conclude by directing to online activities (Nouns in Space, Noun Jump, Noun Jump 2).</li> </ol>	
EXTENSION ACTIVITY SUGGESTIONS	

## Students partner and make up a silly sentence to share with their partner (including a person, place, and thing). The students will need to name the nouns (person, place, and thing) their partner used in the

sentence. The students will take turns making up the sentences and naming the nouns used.2. Provide old magazines. Students create a collage by gluing pictures on a paper with three sections labeled *person*, *place*, and *thing*.

## ADDITIONAL NOTES

- 1. Virtual: Preview game together online.
- 2. ESL and Special Education: Discuss definitions and review ESL vocabulary. Display worksheet and take turns choosing nouns to fill in the blanks. Reread sentences with the chosen noun and repeat. Ask students why the words used are nouns. Repeat definition of nouns together.
