We always eat healthy food.





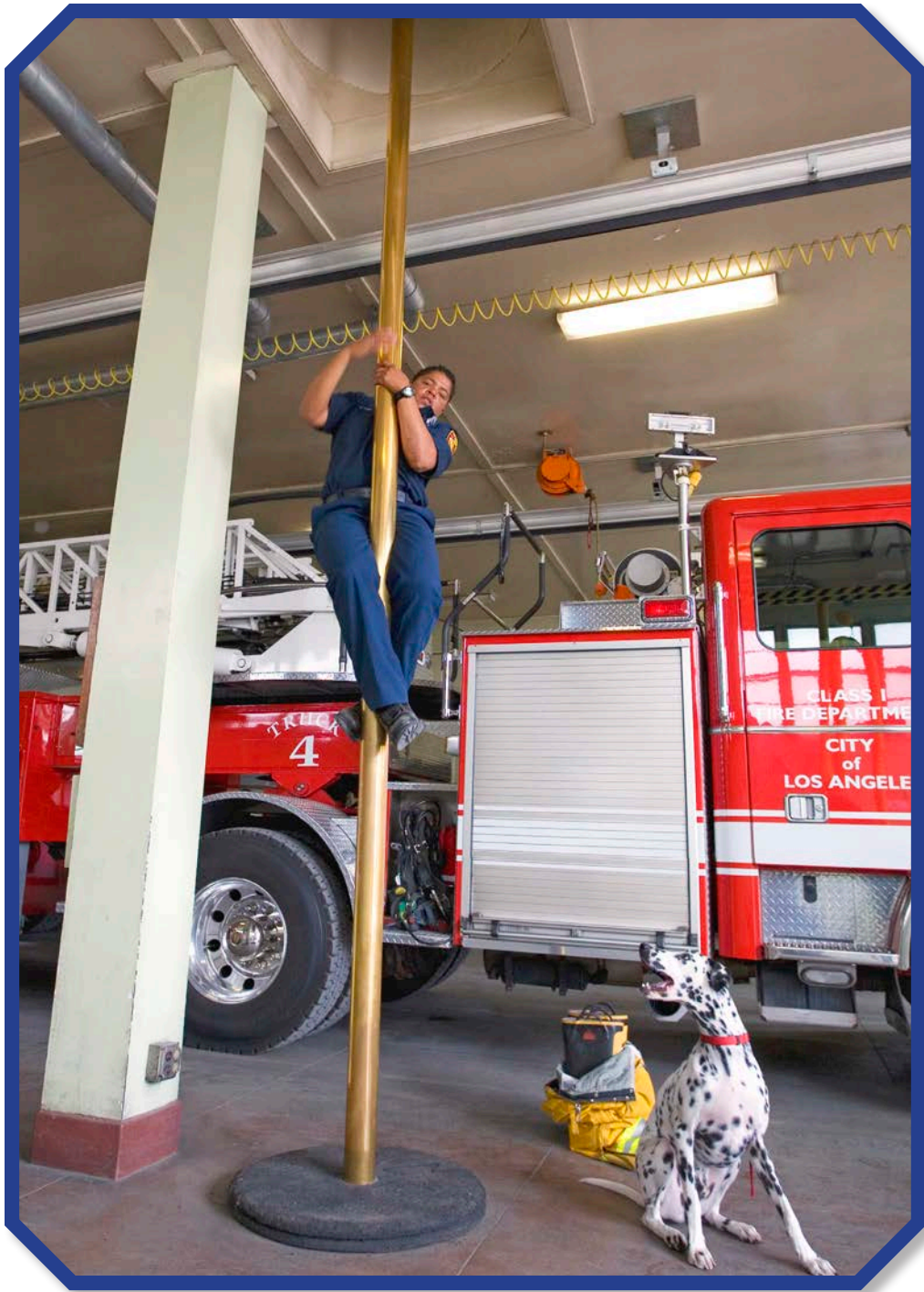
We all help out at the firehouse.

When there is an emergency, we must be ready to go right away!





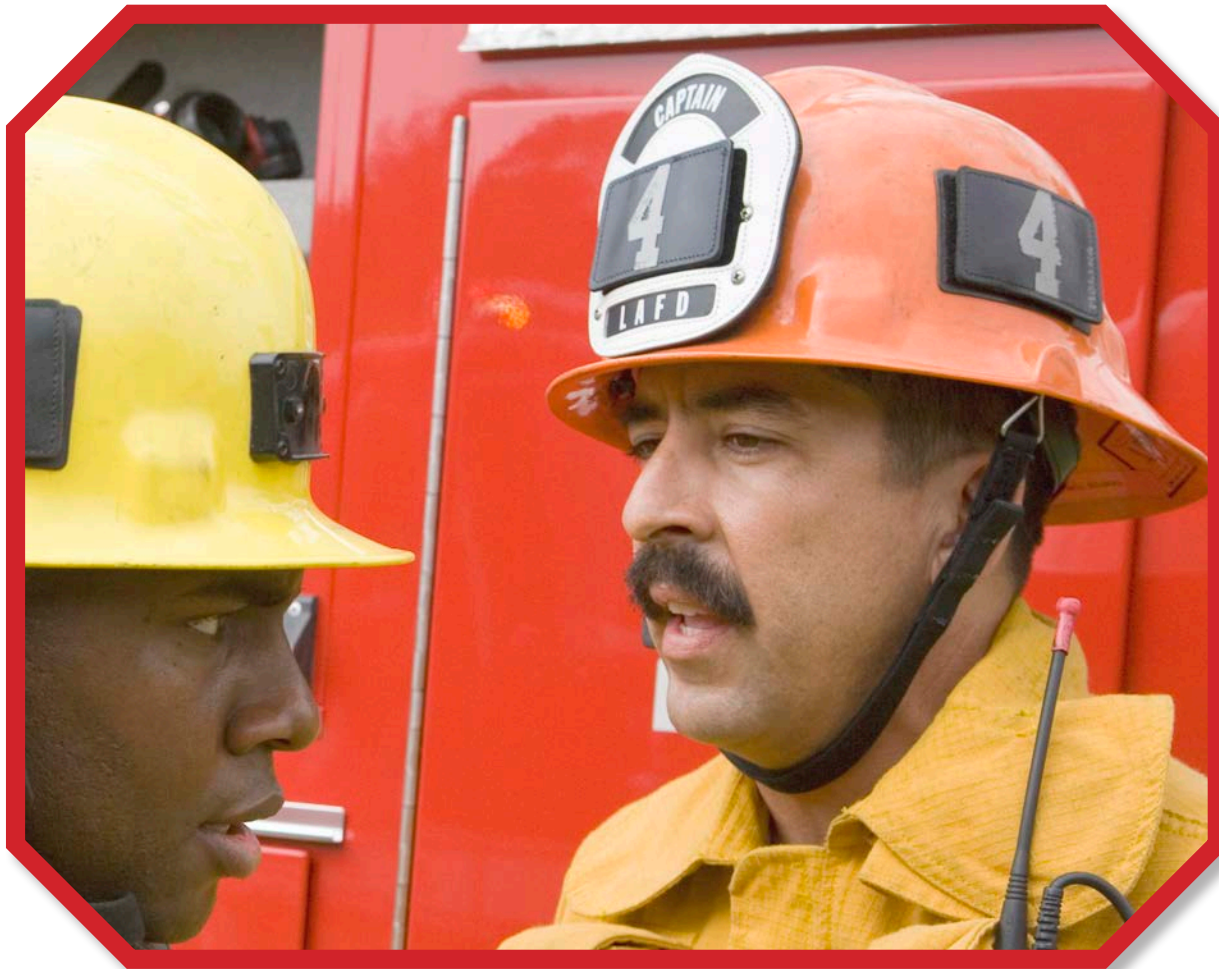
Look out!

Emergency: When something happens that you didn't expect and you need help right away. For example: a fire, a car accident, or someone fell and got hurt.

Fire-Fighting Facts

Firefighters do more...

Firefighters do more than respond to fire alarms. They are often the first on the scene of any emergency and provide first aid until the medical unit arrives.

Firefighters also perform search and rescue missions, control hazardous materials, and respond to disasters.

Firefighters practice and train between alarms. They even perform community service and teach classes on fire prevention and what to do if there is a fire.

Remember: Always have a working smoke detector in your home and change the batteries once a year.



Fire Prevention

- ✗ Never play with matches, lighters, or candles.
- ✗ Never cook without the help of a grown-up.
- ✗ Never overload an electrical outlet.
- ✗ Never leave a fire unguarded.
- ✗ Never put anything over a lamp.
- ✗ Never smoke in bed. In fact, never smoke at all!

What to do if there is a fire...

It is important to have a Fire Escape Plan before a fire happens. Plan two ways out of every room in your home. If your house has security bars, make sure you know how to open them. Pick a safe and easy-to-remember place outside the home to meet your family after you get out. Be sure to plan and practice your Fire Escape Plan with grown-ups.

If a fire does happen...

- ✓ Get out fast!
- ✓ Feel the door before opening it. Start at the bottom and then work your hand up to the top. A hot door means there may be fire on the other side. Try to get out another way.
- ✓ Stay low to the floor.
- ✓ Once you are out, go to your meeting place.
- ✓ Once you are out, call 9-1-1.
- ✓ Don't go back inside *for any reason!*
